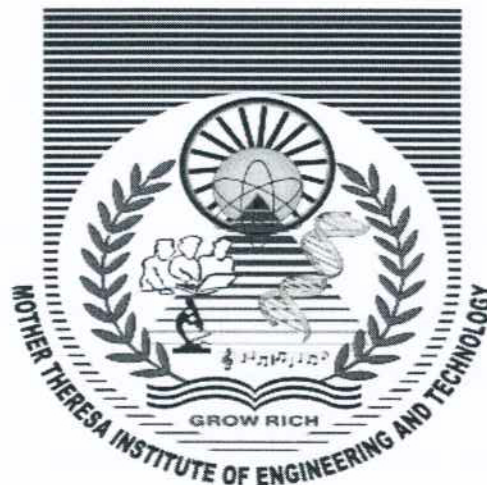

Policy Document On Environment and Energy Usage

Mother Theresa Institute of Engineering and Technology's (MTIET) Environment and Energy Policy would aim at the management of energy in such a way that it has the least possible adverse impact on environment. The policy entails exploring renewable energy resources in order to minimise the government's burden and to identify alternative energy sources as a solution to the energy issue.

This institution's environment and energy policy binds all of its components and applies to all of the institution's stakeholders as well as its varied operations. It assists us in integrating efficiency and environmental consciousness into our daily actions, allowing us to recognise our duties and dedication to natural resource conservation and utilisation. The Green Campus Committee is dedicated to environmental awareness, green initiatives, and green literacy programmes in order to save energy and safeguards the environment.

Policies:

1. To evaluate our energy consumption and its environmental impact.
2. To determine the amount of CO₂ emitted by our modes of transportation (vehicles).
3. To use environmentally friendly automobiles to lessen local air pollution emissions.
4. To make use of bicyclists, public transportation, and pedestrian-friendly roads.
5. To install photovoltaic solar panels for alternative energy generation.
6. To save energy, install LED lighting across the campus.
7. To create a systematic waste management system.
8. To construct a rainwater harvesting unit.
9. To go on a tree-planting mission.
10. To continue to improve our energy consumption by taking further measures.
11. To ensure that we have the resources we need to fulfil our goals.

12. To encourage the use of sophisticated technologies to reduce energy consumption, greenhouse gas emissions, and noise, notably from our fleet of vehicles.
13. To actively collaborate with local groups in the areas of environment, energy efficiency, and sustainable development by engaging in discourse with government agencies, local bodies, and the affiliated institutions.
14. To keep an eye on new environmental and energy challenges and respond appropriately. To increase our own environmental performance through strengthening our staff' and students' environmental knowledge and abilities is felt our duty.
